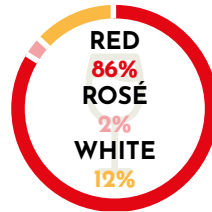

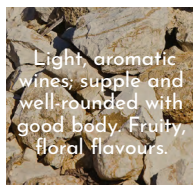
Powerful wines with high alcohol level and full-bodied. Good ageing potential.

Un Cru grandeur Nature

HISTORY

Vines have been grown in the Lirac area for more than 2,000 years. Over the centuries, the town of Roquemaure flourished and became a major port; it was from here that the 'Côte du Rhône' wines were shipped, ready to be served at royal courts in France and beyond.

The village of Saint-Laurent-des-Arbres, a former enclave of the Avignon diocese, still bears the traces of its glorious past. The vineyard growing here belonged to the bishops, and its wines were sent to the Popes in Avignon.

In the 1930s, Count Henri de Régis de Gatimel launched a campaign to have Lirac elevated to AOC status. His efforts were successful, and on 14th October 1947, Lirac officially became a Côtes du Rhône Cru - the first to produce wines across all three colours.
